## LTELs (Long-term English)

- 45 6th and 7th grade students that are LTELs
- Of those 45 students 40 are receiving services (IEP or Read 180 class)
- 5 students not receiving services had an ELPAC score of 3 last year.
- 4 of those 5 students had SBAC scores that would have qualified them for reclassification.
- Chrissy met with every student who got a 3 on the ELPAC.


# Opportunities for Improvement - Achievement, Attendance, Behavior
