



Comprehensive School Safety Plan

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The comprehensive safety plan (CSP) unifies all our Board policies and district safety procedures into one action plan to support the whole educational experience in Cambrian.

- The development of a comprehensive school safety plan is mandated by California Education Code 32281.
- "Safety", in terms of these plans includes aspects of **social**, **emotional**, AND **physical** safety for both youth and adults at our school.

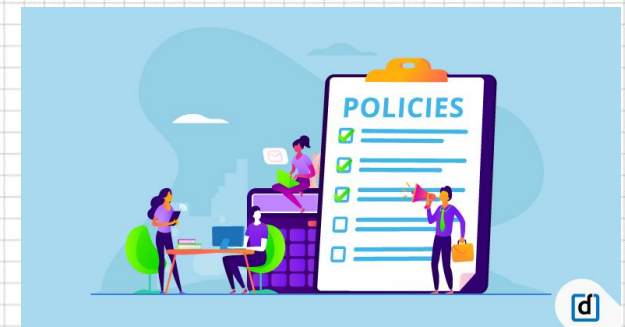


Policies

Each site's comprehensive school safety plan is a document that brings together all of the relevant board and school policies into one document as well as our school's emergency plan.

This document outlines the policies around topics such as:

- Child abuse reporting (as dictated by state and federal law)
- Suspensions and expulsions
- Sexual harassment
- Dress code
- Student discipline
- Our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) plan



Incident Command System

The document also outlines our Incident Command System (ICS) and how we will respond to a variety of incidents such as:

- Fires
- Earthquake
- Intruder on campus
- Flood
- Utility Failure
- Pandemic (developed in spring of 2020 with support from SCCOE)
- Others

Each site's drill schedule is also included.



Updates

Comprehensive Safety Plan Updates:

- New goals for each school site
- Yearly Drill schedule
- ICS system updated
- Pandemic Action Plan (developed in spring of 2020 with support from SCCOE)
 - Action plan identifies key components of the district response to a pandemic:
 - Communication with community, parents, and staff
 - Acquiring adequate stock of medical supplies
 - Following resources from Public Health Department and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for detailed guidelines for processes and operation procedures.

Annual Review Process

This plan is reviewed and readopted on a yearly basis.

- The state asks schools to hold an annual meeting to allow public opinion to be shared about the CSSP. Each site provides the opportunity for community input to be shared through a public meeting.
- The School Site Council will then review and adopt the CSSP before March 1st.
- CSSP is then submitted to the Board for annual approval.
- Once the board approves the document, each school site will make their comprehensive school safety plan available to the public.
