Home to School Transportation Plan March 21, 2024

#### **Transportation Plan (New Requirement)**

In accordance with Education Code 39800.1 (July 10, 2023), the District shall develop a plan describing the transportation services it will offer to its pupils and how it will prioritize planned services for pupils in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and any of grades 1 to 6, inclusive, and pupils who are low income.

The plan shall be adopted by the local educational agency's governing board on or before April 1, 2023, and updated by April 1, each year thereafter.

# **Information - Transportation Funding**

2013-2014	In the enactment of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), State funding for Home to School Transportation was established at a fixed amount, in perpetuity, based on the amount of funding each district received in 2012-13 for General Education and Special Education transportation.  This was accomplished by providing an "add-on" to the LCCF funding. For Cambrian School District this fixed amount is \$159,032.
2022-2023	The State Budget allows districts to receive the greater of the current Transportation add-on augmented for Cost-of-Living adjustment (COLA) or 60% of reported transportation costs.
