












Only intersection with crossing guards (AM and PM).

#### Leigh/Curtner: Speeding is #1 Issue



Curtner Ave. is a <u>Vision Zero Safety</u> <u>Corridor.</u>



Heavy traffic all directions (WB) + VTA bus routes in the mix. Frequent speeding.



No crossing guards at intersection. Main route to Price Middle School & Fammatre Elementary (see green route on map).

Cyclist on sidewalk (no bike lane on Leigh).




Few cyclists in general. Mostly parents. More kids on scooters with parents along Harris. Missed opportunity?

#### Curtner/Doerr Park: Lack of Safe Crossings



Pedestrians crossing at great risk. Nearest crosswalk is ~800 feet away at Leigh/Curtner





Ped desire line/path on Curtner from Parquet Ct. connecting to Doerr Park Easement. Mid-block crossing opportunity

Doerr Park Easement


Lack of crosswalks on Curtner between Leigh and Meridian (over one mile). Unsafe and permissive of vehicular speeding.



#### **Initial Infrastructure Needs**


- Harris @ Exit Driveway
  - High-visibility crosswalk
  - Crossing guards
- Curtner/Leigh: Crossing Guards reinstated
- Add crosswalk at Leigh/Harris (north leg)
- Mid-block crossing Curtner (N/S) between Meridian and Leigh
  - o Ideal connection is Doerr Park easement
  - With visibility enhancements (i.e., flashing beacons)
- Addition of protected bike lanes on portions of Curtner and Leigh
  - Fill bike lane gaps
- Safety infrastructure installed along narrow sidewalks of Curtner/Leigh adjacent to Bagby






#### **Initial Safety & Speed Needs**

- Crossing Guards reinstated at Curtner/Leigh
- Increased enforcement of speeding along Curtner and Leigh Avenues
  - Curtner Avenue Safety Project extension?
  - Radar speed signs to alert drivers to slow
  - Consider <u>time-of-day</u> school speed limit
- Harris Ave. /Harris Ct./Collector Streets
  - Speed controls through neighborhood collector streets on either side of Curtner and Leigh
- Safe Routes to School Study to identify further needs






