Overall Successes


- Very positive school culture


HMH - 80 minute block, 5 days a week for one year we should see about 100 points of lexile growth. We run 45 minute block for a year-long class.

LTELs (Long-term English)

- 45 6th and 7th grade students that are LTELs
- Of those 45 students 40 are receiving services or interventions (IEP or Read 180 class)
- 5 students not receiving services had an ELPAC score of 3 last year.
- 4 of those 5 students had SBAC scores that would have qualified them for reclassification.
- Our amazing Instructional Specialist, Chrissy Terwilliger, met with every student who got a 3 on the ELPAC.


Opportunities for Improvement - Achievement, Attendance, Behavior









ELA Sped




Math Sped





Math SED












CAASPP Math Current 6th Grade 2021/22-2022/23 Data




