#87 – Nationwide Waiver to Allow Noncongregate Feeding

#88 – Nationwide Waiver of Meal Service Time Restrictions

#90 – Nationwide Waiver to Allow Meal Pattern Flexibility





Seamless Summer Option (SSO) and Waiver Timeline

Revenue Stream

Pre-Pandemic - NSLP

- Federal and State reimbursement
- Local revenue from paid meals (\$3.50 Lunch, \$2.00 Breakfast)
- A la carte sales



Pandemic - SSO

 Federal and State reimbursement rate



2021-2022 COVID-19 Policy and Waivers in CNP's Effective July 1, 2021

#85 – Nationwide Waiver to Allow the Seamless Summer Option through School Year 2021-2022

#86 – Nationwide Waiver to Allow Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Reimbursement Rates in School Year 2021-2022

Pandemic - SSO

- Federal and State reimbursement rate
 - Lunch = \$3.82
 - Breakfast = \$2.14

Pandemic - SFSP

- Estimated Federal and State reimbursement rate
 - Lunch = \$4.40
 - Breakfast = \$2.62



Summer and Fall Meal Service

Summer meal distribution program

- Offered at a Price Middle and Fammatre Elementary
- Enrolled Summer School students
- No curbside pick up at Price Middle School (limited staffing available)

Fall Opening

- Plan for pre-packaged sack lunch and sack breakfast
- As pandemic resides, move towards a traditional school food service model (increased menu offerings)
- Assess curbside pick up at Price Middle School (not mandatory)



California Universal Free Meals

- Extends free meals into 2022-2023 school year
- \$650 million in ongoing funds to allow access to 2 free meals daily
- Gives all kids a better shot at growing up healthy and ready to succeed
- Eliminates the stigma that keeps students from eating school meals





Reasons Why Families Should Take Advantage of our Complimentary School Meals

- It extends families grocery budget.
- It saves time planning and preparing meals.
- It is comforting and familiar for kids to have school meals.
- Every meal served is reimbursed by the USDA and funds go toward Child Nutrition staff wages.
- They are not taking food away from someone who needs it more – we have plenty to go around!
