FEDERAL FUNDING

- \$1 trillion for defense, education and health
- Title 1 & IDEA received an increase of \$20 million
- 21 century learning grants took a big cut
- Biden's 2025 budget has a \$2 billion increase on 2023 dollars however it has not been passed yet

- Average woman shops 3x/week and sees impact of price increases
- 50% of people don't have \$500 in savings
- Most people believe education has gotten worse and class sizes are going
 up
- Don't believe job skill training is done in schools
- Chronic absenteeism 17% increase in attendance when families are texted

HEARINGS

- Judiciary Hearing on Al
 - Witnesses included professor from Georgetown, and a biotech company. Basic consensus was Al should not be copyrighted.
 - Title IV New regs shortly
 - No public \$ to for-profit schools
 - Need more learning loss \$
- Workforce committee for Higher Education
 - Witness was Secretary of Education Miguel Cardona
 - A couple of representatives focused on men in women's sports
 - Student loan forgiveness
 - Asked about SD spending of existing federal funds Foreign Affairs USAID discussion aid to countries in need
 - Foreign Affairs USA ID: aid for countries in need



FEDERAL PRIORITIES

- Fulfill the special education promise: currently 7.7% promised 40%
- Teacher recruitment, retention and retirement
 - Support \$2417 Loan Forgiveness Act
 - Windfall Elimination Provision: reduces SSI for those who earned both SSI and Calstrs
 - Government pension offset: reduces spousal SSI benefits for individuals who retire from CALSTRS
- Maintain and expand Broadband access including Erate
- Privacy and cybersecurity: s 1409, s. 1418 protecting student data, HR 2845 which would establish resources and a program to address cybersecurity in elementary and secondary schools
